General Lenten Regulations

ABSTINENCE

Everyone fourteen years of age and older is bound to abstain from meat on ASH WEDNESDAY, the FRIDAYS of Lent, and GOOD FRIDAY.

FAST

Everyone eighteen years of age and older, but under the age of sixty, is also bound to fast on ASH WEDNESDAY and GOOD FRIDAY.

On these two days, the law of fast allows only one full meal a day, but does not prohibit taking some food during the day, so long as this does not constitute another full meal. Drinking liquids during the day is permitted. When health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. In doubt concerning fast or abstinence, a priest assigned to pastoral ministry or confessor should be consulted. In the spirit of penance, the faithful should not lightly excuse themselves from this obligation. Fasting helps us unclutter our minds and hearts of excesses so that we can focus and reflect on our ongoing conversion.

Dr. King Revisited - An Anti-Racism Series for Lent

St. Matthias' Justice and Charity Commission is organizing an anti-racism series for Lent. Entitled *Dr. King Revisited*, this series will draw on Dr. King's *Letter from Birmingham Jail*. Designed through collaboration between the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) and Christian Churches Together (CCT), biblical teachings will guide small-group discussions and create opportunities for reflection and dialogue.

Formed in 2007, CCT is one of the largest ecumenical organizations in the United States and comprises a fellowship of thirty-six national communions including African American, Catholic, Evangelical, Historic Protestant, Pentecostal, and Orthodox. All materials for the program will be provided in advance. Technical support will be provided for all participants.
