### Christ's Holy Priesthood

In the second reading from St. Paul to the Hebrews we see that when Jesus allowed himself to be crucified, he was actually being a priest by offering himself for the sins of the world. After giving his life for us, he takes his place as God's equal. He is now the eternal Priest, so all clergy since the time of Jesus are visible signs of that priesthood. During Mass, we are present at Christ's death and resurrection. When we celebrate the Eucharist, Jesus' eternal sacrifice is there, redeeming all past and future sins. At the Eucharist, we pray with the priest, *"that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God..."* We can offer our lives in sacrifice for sins, giving the suffering we cannot avoid as an offering to God. In this way we take up our cross as Jesus did, and experience God's power in our weakness. All the sacrifices we make, from accepting serious illness, to giving up something for Lent are ways we take part in the priesthood of Christ. The Eucharist also gives us Jesus in his eternal glory, offering salvation by his resurrection. Our sins are forgiven. Thus, through the grace of God and as Jesus lives in us, we can accept God's mercy for us by forgiving one another.

Every priest stands daily at his ministry, offering frequently those same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But this one offered one sacrifice for sins, and took his seat forever at the right hand of God; now he waits until his enemies are made his footstool. For by one offering he has made perfect forever those who are being consecrated.

*Mk 13:24-32*

Jesus said to his disciples: "In those days after that tribulation the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from the sky, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. "And then they will see 'the Son of Man coming in the clouds' with great power and glory, and then he will send out the angels and gather his elect from the four winds, from the end of the earth to the end of the sky. "Learn a lesson from the fig tree. When its branch becomes tender and sprouts leaves, you know that summer is near. In the same way, when you see these things happening, know that he is near, at the gates. Amen, I say to you, this generation will not pass away until all these things have taken place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. "But of that day or hour, no one knows, neither the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father."

**Nicene Creed**

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the Only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven, and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures.
